Summer Gathering 2017 - 2018

Summer Gathering will be in Ngamuwahine Outdoor Education Lodge this year, at the foot of the Kaimai Ranges near Tauranga. Except for lunches and evening meals the camp will be run entirely by Quakers. It is therefore more 'hands on' than recent Summer Gatherings. The theme of 'Back to Basics' reflects our intent to offer outdoor adventures, more simple lifestyle, and great community time together.

Quaker Summer Gathering is an annual residential camp held December to January, with the location being moved around the country each year to minimise travel costs. Summer Gathering has been held each year since 1956. Friends of all ages from all over New Zealand (and some very welcome overseas visitors) join in a holiday atmosphere for relaxation and recreation. In the mornings there is a half hour Meeting for Worship, followed by a choice of contemplative, active (physical), or creative activities, all run by participants. The afternoons and evenings are free for recreation and Open Space events or presentations. The emphasis is on getting to know each other from around the country through such activities as picnics, concerts, dances, walks, all-age games and general fun. We usually have a Cèilidh on New Years Eve with a live band and caller, all done with the talent of our community.

Special Feature

A Quaker Response to Religious Conflict

Many of the seemingly random acts of cruelty and violence in our world today come from radical strands of religions which centre their extreme ideology on a brand of loyalty to a faith which, in their teaching, justifies such acts. How can Quakers respond?

Throughout their history, two major monotheistic faiths, Christianity and Islam, have had at their heart the theological imperative to convert others to their faith. The basis of this belief is that the God who is central to their faith desires all others to come to the same understanding. Because of this, the extreme actions that result are given a divine authority, justification and purpose.

Quakerism came out of the chaos and confusion of a civil war, the execution of a king and the imposition of a military dictatorship. England had been ravaged for more than 10 years by war, which was following on from 120 years of religious conflict across the Catholic/Protestant divide.

George Fox emerged from this civil and religious chaos. Instead of merely following the teachings of others, he taught that we all have to find our own way, our own truth - not by slavish adherence to doctrine, but by looking into ourselves and answering the question 'What canst THOU say?'

The answer to this question was to be based on coming together in silence and stillness, and opening ourselves at the deepest level, to become aware of the 'promptings of love and truth in our hearts,' trusting them as we grapple with the issues of this complex world.

Integrity is one of the core testimonies of Quakerism, and it is to this fundamental spiritual integrity that loyalty lies and is made clear. Quakers believe that there is that of God in every person whatever their creed, belief, behaviour, race, class, or culture. Over recent years, New Zealand has become one of the most diverse nations in the western world. New cultures have brought new religious understandings and faiths. The answer to extremism and intolerance can never be reaction, fear or retaliation. It must come from a response to each and every person, to the promptings of love and truth in our hearts, seeking that of God in everyone and returning fear and hatred with love.

Young People

Children's Meeting

All children are welcome to stay with their parents in the Meeting Room during meeting for worship, if that suits them. There is also a Children's Meeting for those aged 10 and younger. While we say it starts at 10 am, in reality it is helpful for parents to bring their children to the Annex (which is located in the grounds of the Meeting House), a few minutes prior to 10 am so that parents may come into meeting for worship on time. Children are brought into the Meeting for Worship during the final 10-15 minutes before 'the rise of Meeting' at 11 am. They are then cared for during notices (until about 11:15). Young People

All young people are welcome to participate in the Meeting for Worship. In addition, there is a monthly gathering of those aged 10 years or older. Nicknamed the '10 and ups', this group – which also includes parents and other interested adults – meets at 9 am on 3rd Sundays at a local café (currently the Sierra Café, 418 Mt Eden Rd.), and then moves by 10 am to the Mt Eden Meeting House for meeting for worship, as well as a time of reflection/discussion.
